### HOW TO APPLY

- Visit the Law School Admission Council online at [lsac.org](https://lsac.org) for our application, information about the LSAT and a guide to the law school application process.
  - Application opens: *September 15*
  - Priority deadline: *March 1*
  - Application closes: *July 15*
- UBalt School of Law admits students on a rolling basis. First-year applications are accepted for the fall semester only.

### SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

UBalt School of Law offers scholarships and grants to our most qualified applicants. Scholarships or grants were awarded to 60% of the fall 2024 incoming class. The average offer was \$10,000 for Maryland residents and \$24,000 for out-of-state residents.

#### Out-of-State Grants

Some students who do not qualify for in-state tuition may receive a special out-of-state grant of up to \$14,000 for their first year. Grants are based on your LSAT score and undergraduate GPA.

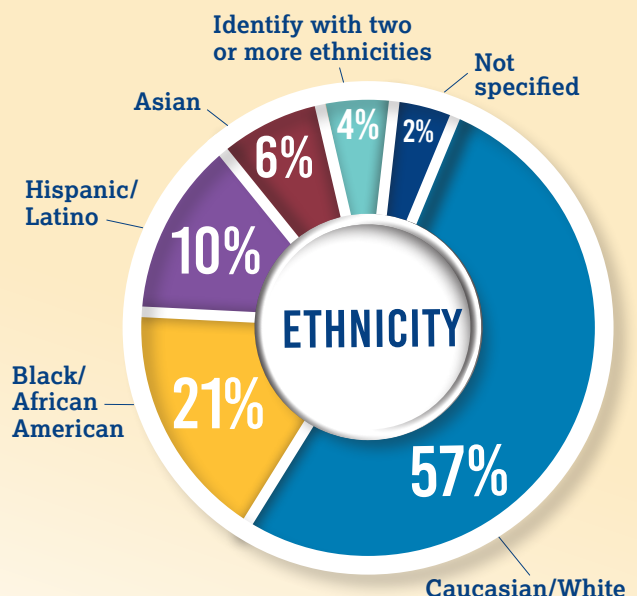
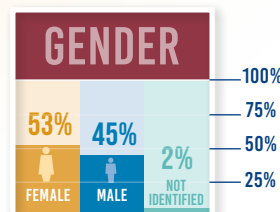

### Regional Tuition

Some students who are not Maryland residents may still be eligible for in-state tuition rates. You may qualify for Maryland in-state tuition if you live in:

- **Northern Virginia:** Arlington, Clarke, Culpeper, Fairfax, Fauquier, Loudoun, Prince William, Rappahannock, Spotsylvania, Stafford, and Warren counties, as well as the cities of Alexandria, Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Manassas, and Manassas Park.

- **Pennsylvania:** Adams, Chester, Lancaster and York counties.

- **Delaware:** all counties.

- **Washington, D.C.**

# A GUIDE TO FINANCIAL AID

## WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?



Financial aid is any form of federal, state, institutional or private funding that helps you pay for law school.

**Scholarships** are funds that you do not need to repay. They're reserved for students with special qualifications like academic achievement, interest in particular fields of study, or financial need. UBalt Law offers:

- Merit scholarships, which are awarded at the time of admission.

**Loans** allow you to borrow money for educational expenses. Loans must be repaid with interest and fall into three major categories:

- Federal student loans (which offer lower interest rates and more flexible repayment plans than most consumer loans)
- Graduate PLUS loans
- Private education loans.



## HOW DO I APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID?

To apply for most types of financial aid, you must fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which will be available in December for the upcoming academic year.

### To complete and file the FAFSA:

1. Create a Federal Student Aid ID at [studentaid.gov](http://studentaid.gov). Select "Create Account."
2. Complete the FAFSA at [studentaid.gov](http://studentaid.gov).
3. Use the University of Baltimore's school code (002102).
4. Sign the FAFSA using your FSA ID.
5. Submit the signed FAFSA, which will ensure that it is sent electronically to UBalt.
