Founding Director of the Criminal Defense and Advocacy Clinic

Founded and directs the Criminal Defense and Advocacy Clinic, a six-credit course in which law students represent indigent individuals charged with misdemeanors and low-level felonies in Baltimore City, Maryland. Created partnership with Roca, a community-based organization, to provide post-conviction representation to organization participants. Teaches Constitutional Criminal Procedure I (investigation). Service has included the Faculty Appointments Committee, Promotion and Tenure Policy Committee, and the Dean's Advisory Committee.

Taught weekly seminar and supervised law students in representation of indigent individuals in criminal defense clinic.
